PRESCOTT TO CROWN KING



A high-clearance, four-wheel-drive vehicle is recommended - Don't attempt the drive in wet weather.

Directions from the campground:

Note: Mileages are approximate. Length: 37 miles one way

- Head south on 89 (left turn)
- Stay on 89 until it takes you to Gurley St.
- Turn left on Mt. Vernon.
- Continue south on Mount Vernon Avenue, which becomes Senator Highway (Forest Road 56), for 12.5 miles to Forest Road 52.
- Turn right onto FR 52 and continue 24.5 miles to Crown King.

The routes to Crown King are as numerous as the mines that once dotted the Bradshaw Mountains, where the popular tourist destination is located. The 37-mile drive from Prescott along Senator Highway is one of the nicest. It begins and ends in ponderosa pine forest and takes in a little of everything in between — from mixed-conifer forests with bigtooth maples and Gambel oaks to high-desert chaparral — all rich with history. It's a beautiful, half-day drive on a road that becomes narrow, rutted and slow-going in spots, making it popular with ATVs and dirt bikes.

Warning: Back-road travel can be hazardous, so be aware of weather and road conditions. Carry plenty of water. Don't travel alone, and let someone know where you are going and when you plan to return.

MINGUS TO JEROME

The staging location for this ride is a paved summit parking lot, on the east side of SR 89A, at the top of Mingus Mountain. After passing through a lower section, the road climbs quickly up the side of scenic Mingus Mountain. Great views of Verde Valley and Sedona looking east. This is an enjoyable forest drive. ATVs are restricted to main Forest Service roads only. Most of the trail is easy except for a few rocky places. Narrow shelf road on east side of Mingus Mountain. It's best to stay off this trail during rainy periods; the last part can get very muddy. Suitable for stock SUVs. Time & Distance: About 19 miles. Allow 2 to 3 hours.

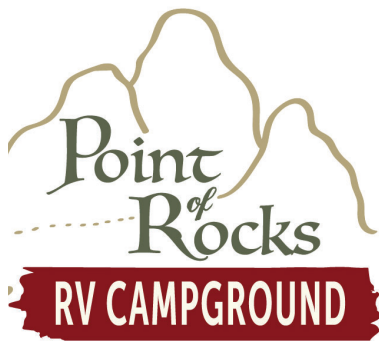

Directions from the campground:

- Turn left on AZ-89 S(118 ft)
- Turn right @ traffic circle onto Willow Lake Rd
- Turn left on Willow Creek Rd (5.2 mi)
- Turn right onto Gail Gardner Way (0.5 mi)
- Turn right onto W Iron Springs Rd (4.8 mi)
- Alto Pit will be on the left

Alto Pit OHV For motorcycles, dirt bikes, ATV's, UTV and SxS 50" wide or less. \$5 Day Use Fee. The off-highway trail system within the recreation area draws enthusiasts of all ages with degrees of skills that prove challenging and enjoyable for everyone alike.

Once an active gravel pit, Alto Pit is now exclusively used for motorized off-road travel. Main Pit is the larger of two gravel pits within the recreation area. West Pit is located a short distance to the southwest of Main Pit. The 20-mile trail system offers challenging rides for advanced recreationists and thrilling rides for beginners.

The rugged landscape that encompasses and surrounds Alto Pit OHV Campground is a nearly perfect setting for off-highway vehicle (OHV) enthusiasts. Granite rock in various stages of degradation is evident and is more pronounced when viewing craggy and rugged Granite Mountain rising abruptly to the north. Predominate vegetation include ponderosa pine, limber pine, oak, manzanita, and a variety of shrubs and grasses. **Try the following restaurants on the way to or back from Alto Pit.**
