Turn right out of the park onto AZ-89 N - 2.8 mi
Turn right onto the AZ-89A N ramp
Keep left, & merge onto AZ-89A - 6.4 mi
At the first light, turn left to stay on AZ-89A N - 20 mi

Whiskey Row/Courthouse

prescott.com/whiskey-row • Whiskey Row is full of some of Prescott's oldest history. This street is named Whiskey Row because of the large number of saloons in one place. Whiskey Row developed after a fire in July of 1900 destroyed the entire block. When reconstructed, there was an inordinate amount of bars rebuilt in the area. At one point the block hosted a total of 40 saloons. Exit the park, turn left and take State Route 89 into the heart of Whiskey Row.

The Elks Building and Theater on East Gurley Street in Prescott, AZ is an Early Commercial style building built in 1904. It has served as a club-house. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978. Tours available upon appointment.

Fain Park

Fain Park offers picnic ramadas, limited gold panning, a refurbished stamp mill, the Barlow-Massick "Castle on the Creek", and the Fitzmaurice historic ruins. The town has not yet developed the historic townsite of Massicks. Neither the Castle nor the Fitzmaurice ruins are open to the public. Fain Lake is stocked by Arizona Game and Fish with rainbow trout.

Goldwater Lake

Goldwater Lake is a reservoir formed by a dam on Bannan Creek, located south of Prescott in North Central Arizona. This lake is maintained by the City of Prescott Parks and Recreation department. The park has facilities for picnicking, fishing, boating, hiking, volleyball, and horseshoes.

Watson Lake is one of two reservoirs at the Granite Dells, outside of Prescott, that was formed in the early 1900's when the Chino Valley Irrigation District built a dam on Granite Creek. The City of Prescott bought the reservoir and surrounding land in 1997 to preserve it as recreational land. Local rock climbers use the granite cliffs above and adjacent to the lake for top-roping and lead climbing.

Sharlot Hall Museum

The Sharlot Hall Museum is an open-air museum located in Prescott. Opened in 1928 by Sharlot M. Hall as the Old Governor's Mansion Museum, it is dedicated to preserving the history and folklore of Yavapai County, AZ.

Sedona

Sedona is an Arizona desert town near Flagstaff that's surrounded by red-rock buttes, steep canyon walls and pine forests. It's noted for its mild climate and vibrant arts community. Uptown Sedona is dense with New Age shops, spas and art galleries. On the town's outskirts, numerous trail-heads access Red Rock State Park, which offers bird-watching, hiking and picnicking spots.

Turn right out of the campground onto 89 N. Merge onto 89A N within 2 miles. Continue on 89A N through Jerome. Once you go through Jerome, you will continue on 89A N for another 45mins leading into Sedona, AZ.

Jerome

Located high on top of Cleopatra Hill (5,200 feet) between Prescott and Flagstaff is the historic copper mining town of Jerome, Arizona. Once known as the wickedest town in the west, Jerome was a copper mining camp, growing from a settlement of tents to a roaring mining community. Four disastrous fires destroyed large sections of the town during its early history, resulting in the incorporation of the City of Jerome in 1899.
